## SGS SABHA CHARITABLE TRUST 4th Annual Report of the Board of Trustees for the year ended 31st March 2007

I have great pleasure in presenting the Fourth Annual Report of the Board of Trustees for the year ended 31st March 2007.

The main activities of the Trust during the year were the running of the Old Age Home and providing medical assistance to the needy.

The audited accounts of the Trust for the year 2006-07 are enclosed. The Trust met 12 times during the year.

The Old Age Home has been functioning well throughout the year under review with all residents extending maximum co-operation and living like a family. They are all quite happy and satisfied with the facilities provided. We are happy to inform that Metro Water connection and Sewerage connection had been obtained from the authorities during the year. RCC ceiling structure and frame work for ground floor kitchen and bathrooms have been provided during the year. As the first floor does not have now enough toilet facilities or kitchen it has not been possible to utilize it for any purpose. Our plans are to have these facilities provided and use the first floor for holding small functions or to augment the strength of the Old Age Home. The work has commenced and is expected to cost about Rs.12,90,000 for civil/electrical/furniture/fittings etc.

The residents of the Old Age Home, as reported last year, do all the work like cooking, cleaning etc. and they are encouraged to watch spiritual programmes on the TV and also bhajans and stotras through audio cassets. Mrs. Vijayalakshmi Pai, a Committee Member of the S.G.S. Sabha, continues to visit the Home regularly to teach them bhajan-singing. Similarly weekly medical check-up of the residents is being done by Dr. (Mrs.) M. Shantha Kamath. Every Thursday from 4 p.m. to 5 p.m. talks are being given in the Old Age Home by Mr. K.R. Baliga, our Trustee, on Srimad Bhagavata, and these have been well-received by the residents.

An enjoyable get together was organized on 15th April 2007to celebrate the completion of two years since the Old Age Home was inaugurated. All the residents together sang good bhajans for about 90 minutes. This was highly appreciated by all the invitees. It is gratifying to note that the entire expenses on the get-together were sponsored by Mr. P.R. Shenoy which coincided with his mother Smt. Sanjeevi Bai's 80th birthday. The Board of Trustees and the residents of the Old Age Home wish Smt. Sanjeevi Mayi many more years of happy and healthy life. All those who had gathered were requested to express their views and offer suggestions on running of the Old Age Home. Quite a few useful suggestions were received and the Board of Trustees will consider implementing them in course of time. The Home continues to have 11 residents.
